Student Presentation

- According to the syllabus, 5 points of your final grade goes to your presentation.
- Presentations has to be on the biography, major themes, and contribution of the scholar of the day.
- In our class we have 40 students, and we will cover 12 figures, from Thomas Hobbes (1588-1679) to W.E.B. Du Bois (1868-1963).
- Each student has to present at least once.
- On the second day of class, the *Student Presentation Sheet* will be handed over to you. Choose the figure and put your name next to it.
- For the presentations on Marx, Weber, and Durkheim 4 individuals must register. The presentation on these three thinkers should be around 15 minutes.
- For the rest of presentations at least <u>3</u> and maximum <u>4</u> students should sign up. The presentation should be maximum <u>10</u> minutes long.
- Find your groupmates and start collaborating on producing your PowerPoint Presentations.
- The PowerPoint files must be emailed to me the night before, no later than 11:00 pm.
- The email's subject line, for example, has to be: "Student Presentation: Karl Marx."
- In the body of the email the division of labor must be clearly mentioned. For instance, X did the bibliographical research, Y did the theoretical section, and Z did the contributions of the scholar to sociological analysis.
- The PowerPoint presentations must include (1) cover page: name of the scholar, a picture of her/him and students' names; (2) brief biography of the figure; (2) her/his main concepts; (3) his/her main contributions; and (4) list of references.
- To get 5 points out of 5, all these instructions must be precisely followed.
