Max Weber: The history of human being is the history of struggle for domination/ Legitimacy, power, and domination/ Forms of authority/ Myth of superiority/ Internalization/ Life chances/ Bureaucracy and the iron cage

Emile Durkheim: The history of human being is the history of different forms of solidarity (collective consciousness, legal systems)/ Social facts: race/ethnicity, class, gender, family background, education, legal system, etc./ Collective consciousness/ Law/ Different forms of punishment in different types of solidarity/ Crime and deviance/ Law and customs/ Function of /crime and deviance.
